



## Hyderabad

Hyderabad is the capital of the Indian state of Telangana and de jure capital of Andhra Pradesh. Hyderabad was historically known as a pearl and diamond trading centre, and it continues to be known as the "City of Pearls". Occupying 650 square kilometres (250 sq mi) along the banks of the Musi River, it has a population of about 6.7 million and a metropolitan population of about 7.75 million, making it the fourth most populous city and sixth most populous urban agglomeration in India.




## Charminar

Golkonda, also known as Golconda, Gol konda, or Golla konda, is a citadel and fort in Southern India and was the capital of the medieval sultanate of the Outb Shahi dynasty, is situated 11 km west of Hyderabad.
